Katie Fielding, STEM Coach at Prince William County Schools in Virginia, defined sustained professional development as "engaging PD that occurs over an extended time, allows participants to share resources while practicing what they've learned, observing each other in action, and discussing what they've learned."

Fielding also highlighted the benefits of using Canvas LMS to engage educators while they learn and inspire them with ways to utilize the tool in their classrooms.

Other key takeaways included:

- using Canva templates to build teacher reflection rubrics
- providing asynchronous opportunities for teachers to learn on their time
- opening the communication & collaboration lines by organizing a schoolwide book or podcast club





How to Roll Out a New LMS: One District's Story

BLENDED PD FOR SMOOTH CANVAS IMPLEMENTATION

For all the non-coffee drinkers in the (Zoom) rooms, Ashley May and Jasmine Oguntuga from the Educational Technology team at Spring Branch ISD led a session on creating "the perfect Canvas LMS smoothie." After their previous LMS left the North American market in June 2021, they needed a new solution to support every student. They chose Canvas LMS as their new learning management system. Content migration was top-of-mind for their educators.

"We had seven years on our previous LMS. We gave our teachers and staff this analogy: migrating to Canvas LMS is like moving. When you pack your house, you don't take everything with you. Let's take this moment to look at what we want to pack up and take with us and what we want to leave and replace with something great," May said.

By working together, they outlined a three-phase approach to implementation. Phase One began in Spring 2022 with their "Canvas Ready Roadshow kickoff." On their tour, their team visited every school in the district to ensure every teacher felt confident about the change and facilitated an asynchronous Canvas Foundations course. Phase Two involved meeting with district leaders to ensure they were also Canvas Ready. For every in-person training they led, they made a companion Canvas course available to attendees, their families, and parents.

Canvas LMS is more open, and users can see more. We had to have a course there for our parents to see too.

And the final phase - Canvas Go - extended into the school year.

Oguntuga held Tech Tuesdays and Lunch and Learns for educators to dive deeper into Canvas LMS as they used it in the classroom. By engaging all stakeholders and making resources available online and in person, May said they had "the smoothest transition possible."


The ultimate goals when creating a digital culture are for students:
